

Blessing of the Homes at Epiphany

The Church has a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6th) and the season which follows, ending on Shrove Tuesday (February 16th). Historically, family and friends would gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to invite the clergy of the church to visit your home for the blessing. During this liturgy, "20 + C + M + B + 21" may be written with chalk above the home's entryway. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless this house." The "+" signs represent the cross of Christ and the numbers "2021" indicate the year of the blessing.

Chalk and printed prayers will be made available for you to take home for private prayers. Fr. Tom would also be glad to offer prayers of blessing for your home if requested. It is a blessing to your clergy to share in your lives! Being invited to offer this gift of the church to your home would be a great joy, so please don't hesitate.



The Bells of St. Mary's are back with rehearsals each Thursday at 5pm.

We will set up bells and begin rehearsal with music reading skills followed by repertoire (songs we learn). Everyone should be able to be present by 5:30pm. Some will be able to be at church earlier than others, so we could have a set-up crew and a clean-up crew. The aim is to have the actual rehearsal concluded between 6:15-6:30pm followed by clean-up. We are excited to enjoy the music of a hand bell choir at St. Mary's!



Ministry Scheduler Pro

A Ministry Scheduler Tutorial from Gerry Fox

The new year is a great time to reacquaint yourself to the Ministry Scheduler. In 2018, St. Mary's began using the Scheduler to schedule, remind, and help our lay ministers, the Church staff, & Fr. Tom keep track of those who serve each Sunday. Servers were added to a database separated by their choice of ministry: Acolyte, Eucharistic Minister, Lector, Usher, Greeter, Altar Guild, and Breakfast Team. When the schedule was set up, all of the positions were randomly selected from the database and put into the schedule. If a person had conflicts, they could ask for a "sub" and other ministers could accept to replace them. Emails were sent out every Monday to remind people that they were serving for the next Sunday service.

When the pandemic began, in-person worship was suspended and the Scheduler was not needed. As in-person *outdoor* worship began in the summer, Lectors were personally called and reminded. When in-person *indoor* worship resumed in the fall, more ministers were needed and phone calls to fill those positions became quite time-consuming. The Scheduler was re-activated in December to help with scheduling and reminding. The types of ministers have changed as well. **For the 8am service**, there is only one Lector and one Usher (no Eucharistic Ministers and no Breakfast Team). **For the 9:30am service**, there is only one Lector, one Crucifer, two Torchbearers, and three Ushers/Greeters. **For the online recorded service**, there are two Lectors (this service date is recorded on the Thursday before the online worship date.) It is more important than ever that our ministers stay informed and are diligent in not only asking for "subs," but ensuring that subs are attained because there are no extra people to fill in if someone is missing. If you do not feel that this is the time for you to serve during the pandemic, please notify Gerry Fox so that you may be listed "inactive" for the time-being. Please take some time to re-familiarize yourself with the Ministry Scheduler, its app, and the "live" schedule: www.rotundasoftware.com/ministry/stmaryskinston/schedules/565452. If you need some one-on-one help, email Gerry Fox at gfoxjr@gmail.com. The Scheduler is a tool to help us ease the burden of contacting people each week to serve. It is our hope, with your help, it will do just that.



