

From the Rector

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace..."

These words begin one of the most widely known and beloved prayers: the prayer attributed to St. Francis, whose feast day in October coincides with animal blessings and other thanksgivings for the gifts of Creation. You can find his prayer in the Book of Common Prayer (pg. 833), or nowadays by a quick Google search or asking "Alexa," who will probably read it to you if you ask nicely. I commend it to you the next time you prepare for Sunday worship in a quiet moment in a pew at St. Mary's, or on the West Lawn, or in the sacred space you choose for an online liturgy.

"Lord, make me an instrument of your peace..." Thanks be to God, worship does change us. That's part of why Christians have always believed that corporate worship, together, is such an important part of the life of faith. And it is important how we worship. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Christians everywhere have grappled with how to maintain the integrity of their worship, while also living into the most faithful ways of safeguarding the health of others in their community. I have been so proud of how the people of St. Mary's have, and continue to do this work of discernment and practice well.

I am pleased, also, that as I write these words, we are discerning the most fitting way to bring back to our liturgies the practice of sharing communion wine as part of our Eucharistic celebrations! New guidelines from the Diocese of East Carolina have just been published that offer a framework for consecrating wine from a single vessel, sharing it with individuals/families in separate containers, and ensuring that all containers that have held consecrated bread & wine may be properly cleaned and cared for. You may expect to hear an update from me about this in a pastoral letter soon.

In the meantime, may we continue to pray that we would be changed into God's instruments of peace and any other kind, in accordance with God's will. May we fully expect such a change to truly happen in our lives. And, may we look forward to even greater joy in the ways that we share life together!

Consecration Sunday Is Coming!



Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes. St. Mary's Vestry

has selected the <u>New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program</u> as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis. <u>New Consecration Sunday</u> is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. <u>New Consecration Sunday</u> encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?" Each Sunday of October, we will have a guest speaker during the announcements period of our service. Then, on **Consecration Sunday, October 24th**, we will have a guest preacher who will include a brief period of instruction and inspiration, concluding with an opportunity for members to make their commitments as a <u>confidential</u> act of worship. Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday, either online or in-person. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. Thank you in advance for your enthusiastic participation in Consecration Sunday!


Life with St. Mary's A Newcomer Gathering



Vestry




The Vestry of St. Mary's has a vital role in the leadership of this parish. Broadly defined by the Canons of the Episcopal Church and our diocese, the responsibilities of the vestry encompass areas of leadership and management in partnership with the Rector. Serving on the Vestry of St. Mary's is service to Christ Himself and is an honor and privilege. Vestry members usually meet on the third Monday of every month and occasionally in other called meetings. Attendance is extremely important. Each Vestry member is responsible for overseeing at least one area of parish ministry. Twelve Vestry members serve for rotating

terms of three years each. Four Vestry members are elected each year at the Annual Parish Meeting that occurs on the second Sunday of Advent. This year, it will be Sunday, December 5, 2021.

The qualifications for Vestry eligibility:

"Adult" member (sixteen years or older) who has been confirmed and is faithful in corporate worship as evidenced by the receiving of Communion in this church three (3) times during the previous year, unless for good cause prevented; and, has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

• Please note: on October 10, a list of parishioners eligible for Vestry service will be shared with the church membership. Please check this list for accuracy immediately and notify the church office if any corrections need to be made. More details about this year's Vestry discernment process will be shared in November.
