


From the Rector

GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD,

his love endures forever.

Not to be confused with only a "November thing," Psalm 107 says to GIVE THANKS anytime and for the endless array of ways in which God's steadfast love shows up in our lives! Now, I'm not trying to be a Thanksgiving Day hum-bug... far from it! Holidays and seasons should draw our attention at particular times and in particular ways to practices that can also find faithful expression at many other times. And so as you observe the Thanksgiving holiday this month, I encourage you to pay special attention to God's work in and around you, in these days, and in previous seasons of your life. As the Psalmist implores, may we give thanks



to God in prayer. Maybe then you will also want to share some of these expressions of thanks on the "Thankful Tree" here at St. Mary's (see pg. 7). Maybe you will also be led to point out to another person how you've witnessed God at work in their life. If you're one who gives thanks for music, listen to Wendell Kimbrough (a friend of St. Mary's Church) sing "Oh Give Thanks" which is his song based on this psalm. We thank you, Lord.

For health and strength to work, and leisure to rest and play,

We thank you, Lord.

For the brave and courageous, who are patient in suffering and faithful in adversity,

We thank you, Lord.

For all valiant seekers after truth, liberty, and justice,

We thank you, Lord.

For the communion of saints, in all times and places,

We thank you, Lord.

Above all, we give you thanks for the great mercies and promises given to us in Christ Jesus our Lord; To him be praise and glory, with you, O Father, and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Vestry Nomination Process


The Vestry of St. Mary's has a vital role in the leadership of this parish, and St. Mary's will soon elect its next 4-person class of vestry leaders using the process we adopted in 2020.

- 1. On October 17, a preliminary list of members who are eligible to serve on the vestry was shared via email. Please contact the church office by Thursday, November 4 with any needed corrections.
- 2. On Friday, November 5, nomination forms will be emailed and posted in the Narthex with instructions on the "Nomination by Ballot" process. Nominations by Ballot will be received by all eligible voters until 11:59pm on Friday, November 19.
- 3. The Vestry's Nominating Committee will form a 4-person candidate slate based on the nomination ballots. In the event of a tie, the Nominating Committee will be trusted to discern an appropriate solution based on the needs of the parish.
- 4. The Annual Parish Meeting will take place during the 9:30am liturgy on Sunday, December 5, 2021 during which the 4-person slate will be voted on. Please plan now to attend worship this joyous day!

Serving on the Vestry of St. Mary's is service to Christ himself and is an honor and privilege. Please be in prayer for discernment about who you sense may be called to serve in this way and may God bless the leadership of this church.

Adult Christian Formation




Join us each Sunday morning at 10:45am in Moseley Hall and via Zoom for Adult Christian Formation. In the beginning of November, we will continue our viewing and discussion of the film series, "The Chosen." In person sessions will view the video in the Parlor or Vestry Room from 10:45-11:25am, then gather in Moseley Hall for group discussion from 11:25-11:45am. Then, as we approach the Advent season, we will "press pause" on viewing "The Chosen" and begin Advent Conspiracy: Making Christmas Meaningful (Again). We will ask ourselves: Am I tired of how consumerism has stolen the soul of Christmas? This year, take a stand! Join the groundswell of Christ-followers who are choosing to make Christmas what it should be - a joyous celebration of Jesus' birth that enriches our hearts and the world around us, not a retail circus that depletes our pocketbooks and defeats our spirits. As we reflect on this, we will read Advent Conspiracy. Advent Conspiracy offers thoughts on how to substitute consumption with compassion by practicing four simple but powerful, countercultural concepts: Worship Fully - because Christmas begins and ends with Jesus; Spend Less - and free your resources for things that truly matter. Give more - of your presence, your

hands, your words, your time, your heart. Love All - the poor, the forgotten, the marginalized, and the sick in ways that make a difference.




