### From the Rector



#### "The Blood of Christ. The Cup of Salvation."

-Words spoken by the Eucharistic Ministers at St. Mary's on Sunday, March 8, 2020 and Sunday, November 28, 2021

We had waited a long time (630 days) to hear these words spoken at the liturgy at St. Mary's. During the pandemic, we have waited for a lot of things. We have hoped for a lot of things. And on the First Sunday of Advent, 2021, after much careful preparation, a very sacred element of worship returned as wine was shared at communion.

I am grateful for the questions that were asked as we prepared for this special day. With safety measures leading us to use individual cups,

some members of the church asked "What qualifies as an appropriate cup for such a sacred gift?" With Anglican Eucharistic theology teaching that Jesus is *truly present* at communion, others asked "How should we care for the residual wine in the cups?" These thoughts fed a rich conversation in our community that resulted in the communion practices <u>outlined in my recent pastoral letter</u>. This included the creation of some beautiful cups (two pictured above next to a chalice) in a project coordinated by Renée Herlong.

Advent is commonly understood by many to be a season of waiting, of hope, of expectation. The season points very directly towards Christmas as we prepare to celebrate once again the joy of the first coming of Jesus at the Incarnation. The season's Sunday readings also point us towards a time that has yet to be: the second coming of Jesus when He will "with power and great glory" (Luke 21:27). We wait for more moments of God's revelations of divine presence in and among us. We hope, expectantly, for God's promises of ultimate peace and fullness of life to be realized. I wonder what this looks like in your life. May this Advent bring blessings to you in your waiting, hoping, preparing among this community.

Recently, Vicki Kennedy, who is a current Vestry member and chair of the Worship Committee, had a letter to the editor published in the Daily Reflector. During this Advent season, we reflect on God's presence with us and around us and invite you to read Vicki's editorial here to meditate on His presence in all of creation and the joy that we can have in its care.

Yes, the Glasgow climate summit is over. Media pundits are busy with post-game analysis: who won, who lost, what are next year's prospects. But if you are a Christian, or a person of any faith who believes that God created the earth and its intricate, amazing system of nature, set aside the post-conference critique and consider this.

Truly, the world God created is an intricate beautiful garden overflowing with grandeur and goodness. Yet we look around and see waste, trash, pollution. We hear about melting glaciers and disappearing rain forests. Politicians may argue over the causes. But clearly, God's world needs tending to.

Imagine that tomorrow you came into your home church and saw trash scattered in the aisle, stained glass smeared with grease, an altar turned over. Would you say, "Well I didn't do it" and walk away? Would you leave the mess for others to look at and walk through on Sunday morning? Or would you do your part to clean it up, regardless of how or by whom it was made? Would you sacrifice your time and effort to do what serves God's holy place?

Don't let the politicians' words bother you. You don't have to call it environmentalism, or being green, or being a liberal. Call it serving God. Because that's what it is. We cannot love the Lord with all our heart, mind, and soul if we do not take better care of his creation. And we cannot claim to love our neighbor if we let his home become a wasteland.

This is the good news we are called to share. Taking care of God's created world is not a burden but a joy — a gift of love and gratitude that each of us can offer.

### **Annual Parish Meeting**




