



## Worship



#### Blessing of the Homes at Epiphany

The Church has a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany (January 6th) and the season which follows, ending on Shrove Tuesday (March 1st). Historically, family and friends would gather to ask God's blessing on their homes and those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to invite the clergy of the church to visit your home for the blessing. During this liturgy, "20 + C + M + B + 22" may be written with chalk above the home's entryway. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi who bear gifts to the Christ Child at Epiphany: Caspar,

Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless this house." The "+" signs represent the cross of Christ and the numbers "2022" indicate the year of the blessing.

Fr. Tom would be glad to offer prayers of blessing for your home if requested. It is a blessing to your clergy to share in your lives! Being invited to offer this gift of the church to your home would be a great joy, so please don't hesitate.



#### **Breakfast Suspension Continues**

With the Omicron variant now in North Carolina and COVID transmission in Lenoir County as "high," the St. Mary's Vestry reached

consensus to continue the suspension of our Sunday morning breakfast for the time-being. The Vestry will reassess this situation at its next meeting. Read our current COVID-related gathering guidelines on our website, or by clicking here.

The Altar Guild is under the Worship **M**inute Commission of St. Mary's. Men and WINISTRY women prep the altar before and clean up after worship in the sanctuary and the chapel. Candles are replenished with oil, wine and wafers are prepared, and service hangings are changed according to the church year so that colors match the church season. Additionally, some participants are devoted to the task of cleaning and pressing linens. There are numerous tasks, and many hands make work light. There are a number of teams who provide these prayerful services for our worship, and currently each team serves about once a month.
