

Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and selfdenial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word."

-From the Ash Wednesday Liturgy (BCP, pg. 265)

How are you doing? Essentially, this is the question that begins the season of Lent for those who worship with the Ash Wednesday Liturgy. It isn't a rhetorical question! The observance of a holy Lent begins with selfexamination - a probing of our hearts, our minds, our habits and practices. And in this prayerful assessment, we ask that God will speak to us about what we find that is pleasing to God and what is displeasing, to guide us towards whatever would honor His current call on our lives, and to empower us to do the same. The church tells us what the Bible has made clear and what we know within ourselves: prayer, fasting, self-denial, and engaging with God's holy Word are all life-giving things that will be means of God's blessings in our lives.

At the time of publishing, Lent is just around the corner. Hopefully you're reading these words with a couple weeks before the season begins. But regardless of the day or time, take the opportunity now to pray about and commit to certain practices that will encourage selfexamination and draw you closer in intentional relationship with God and those whom God has placed in your life. Remember, there is no "right" answer about how to "do" Lent, and what seems fitting for you may not be what God is calling any other person into.

So, how are you doing? The question is asked because you are loved: by me, by the Church, by God. May God richly bless you this Lent.

## News at St. Mary's




At 5:30pm on Tuesday, January 19th, St. Mary's Episcopal Church participated in a nationwide call of remembrance for the 400,000+ Americans who have died from COVID-19. During our ceremony, Father Tom offered prayers for the deceased, especially those lives lost in Lenoir County, as well as those who mourn, those who are still in recovery from the virus, and all the care-providers who support our community. Everette Haddad (*pictured left*), son of Audra and Mike Haddad and Boy Scout 2nd Class with Troop 41, rang the bells of St. Mary's 40 times, once for each 10,000 COVID-19 deaths. #### **Our Library: A Treasure** ~ From Randy Spaugh

Margaret and I began visiting here about two years ago. There were compelling reasons to make St Mary's our church home, which primarily consisted of the people we met and the meaningfulness of worship. But there were also treasures here. The Boar's Head Festival and the St. Barnabas Church

come to mind. There is at least one treasure that is seldom a topic of conversation. There is a bookstore located in the Vestry Room just across the hall from Tom's Study. That in itself is hardly what we would call a treasure. Many Churches have bookstores. Yet, not everybody has the selection of books you find here. I would be willing to guess that there is not another bookstore between Raleigh and the beach with a selection of books on Spirituality and the history of Spirituality that is any better. Even commercial bookstores have abandoned this area of interest. Since this has been my area of focus, I can tell you that these are excellent titles by well known authors on the subject (such as Henri Nouwen, Thomas Merton, Barbara Brown Taylor, and Kathleen Norris) as well as ancient figures (such as Teresa of Avila, John of the Cross, and Benedict of Nursia) and many, many more. Whoever picked these books gave us this treasure. Stop by the bookstore and see if there is not something that peaks your interest.

**Beginning in February,** St. Mary's will serve as a Field Education church for Gregory Smith, a Postulant who is in formation to become a priest. Greg lives in Goldsboro, and his sponsoring church is St. Andrew's. His first Sunday at St. Mary's will be Sunday, February 7.

Greg Smith was born 68 years ago in Williamston, North Carolina, where he attended E.J. Hayes School for grades 1-

8. His family moved to Alexandria, Virginia where he attended T.C. Williams High School (of "Remember the Titans" fame) for two years and graduated from George Washington High School in 1970. Following high school he served in the United States Air Force for twenty years during which he trained as an Independent Duty Medical Technician and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Management from Golden Gate University, San Francisco, California. After retirement from the military, he returned to North Carolina, earned his teaching certification at East Carolina University, taught middle school science and social studies in the Wayne County Public Schools System, and retired from his second career in 2013.

Due to his calling to the ministry, with God's help, he is now embarking on a third career, having completed the two-year Alternative Clerical Training at Sewanee's School of Theology (ACTS) in June 2020. This time at St. Mary's will provide Greg with formative practical parish experience, and we look forward to partnering in ministry with him during this time and in the future.
