

From the Rector

The commandment of men and the Commandment of God

I want to tell you, dear reader, that I really like the season of Lent. There's a part of my nature & personality that thrives on being challenged... it's good to press intentionally towards good and holy endeavors. I love how the season urges us to try on new practices for a specific amount of time. Forty days or so is long enough to let a pattern of faithful living begin to shape you: to learn a few guitar chords to sing God's praises, to sense the benefits of a Biblically-based diet, to physically exercise enough to see if you might also be able to say something like "When I run [or your exercise of choice], I feel God's pleasure." But there is an unfortunate thing that might also happen in Lent to which we should be sensitive: a Lenten discipline might turn into another form of the Law, rather than an opportunity to experience God's blessings of grace. Friends, I pray that you are taking the season and its purpose of drawing you closer to our Lord seriously... and that you are being mindful that, as the story below beautifully illustrates, the "Commandment of God" are infinitely more

As we move to each of the fourteen markers throughout the church, a different event of Jesus' Passion is remembered. This is an especially powerful way "that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby [God] has given us life and immortality," to quote the Prayer Book's collect for Palm Sunday. St. Mary's also offers a drive-thru, outdoor Way of the Cross near the

West Lawn during this season. Please consider travelling the Way of the Cross at least once this Lent.

A HOLY WEEK AT HOME LITURGY BOOKLET will be provided again this year for all who would like to observe this sacred time in that way.

PALM SUNDAY LITURGY ~ March 28, at 9:30 am; Online & Outdoors, weather permitting

This Liturgy begins with the Blessing of the Palms and the outdoor liturgy includes a procession of the congregation from the front lawn, near the stone sign, to the West Lawn. In the event of inclement weather, this service will move indoors with livestream for overflow seating in Moseley Hall as needed.

MONDAY IN HOLY WEEK: YOUTH-LED LITURGY ~ March 29 at 5:30pm; Details to follow

TUESDAY IN HOLY WEEK: HOLY EUCHARIST ~ March 30 at 5:30pm; Church Nave

WEDNESDAY IN HOLY WEEK: TENEBRAE ~ March 31 at 7:30 pm; Church Nave

Tenebrae (Latin for "Darkness" or "Shadows") has been a name for night and early morning services of the last three days of Holy Week that will offer a meditation upon, and a prelude to, the events of our Lord's life between the Last Supper and His Resurrection.

MAUNDY THURSDAY ~ April 1 at 7:00 pm; Online & Church Nave

This service recalls the institution of the Last Supper and Jesus' humble act of washing His disciples' feet. It ends with the stripping of the altar and the beginning of a vigil throughout the night. Following the Maundy Thursday liturgy, a prayer vigil with the Reserved Sacrament begins in the Chapel and ends with communion at the Good Friday liturgy. Parishioners will be invited to sign up for the vigil.

GOOD FRIDAY ~ April 2 at Noon; Online & Church Nave

This service begins with silent prayer and includes a homily, the Solemn Collects, the Veneration of the Cross, and the Eucharist from the Reserved Sacrament. The Way of the Cross will also be offered in the church at **5:45 pm**, ending the Good Friday observance.

HOLY SATURDAY EASTER VIGIL ~ April 3 at 7pm; Outdoors

EASTER SUNDAY ~ April 4 at 9:30am; Online & Outdoors, weather permitting

We will celebrate Easter morning with one service of Holy Eucharist on the West Lawn at 9:30am. In the event of inclement weather, this service will move indoors with livestream for overflow seating in Moseley Hall as needed. Children are welcome to bring Easter baskets for a special egg hunt immediately following the service.

The Rector's F o r u m continues its discussion of


