

# From the Rector









## A New Season

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent. For Christians around the world, and throughout millennia, this time of preparation for Holy Week & Easter brings opportunity for renewal and deepening of life whenever the season's practices are approached as offerings and gifts of devotion to God.

There are many areas of devotion to which the Church invites our renewed attention in Lent: self-examination & repentance; prayer, fasting, & self-denial; reading & meditating on God's holy Word. It is, of course, a matter of each individual's personal piety and sense of call that drives that person's approach to the observance of a "Holy Lent." I pray that each of us will embrace this season's opportunities and, in so doing, be blessed by God.

As a community, I invite you to make an intentional commitment to worshipping & learning with your St. Mary's family this Lent. What joy it is to be together in worship, and now even more opportunities are available, including community meals (see below) and Wednesday evening programs (see page 6). This year's Lenten program will focus on the practice of fasting in its many forms. We have some wonderful speakers who will join us from near & far. Also, we will be fasting from extra paper consumption in our Sunday bulletins. Accordingly, we'll open the Prayer Books - you're welcome to bring your own (maybe from your baptism or confirmation), or use the books in the pews. This will reduce our bulletin length by a third and remind us all of the riches that this prayer resource is!

Truly, this community and church family is a gift! I am grateful for you and look forward to God's blessings through our Lenten journey together!

## Community Meals Return

With much consideration of the updates on the state of the pandemic situation locally, at its February meeting, the Vestry approved the return to offering community meals at St. Mary's Church. The first such offering was the Pancake Supper on Shrove Tuesday. Then, beginning Sunday, March 6th, St. Mary's will resume the Sunday morning breakfasts provided by the men of the church. In addition, we will include an evening meal as part of the upcoming Lenten Wednesday Night Programs beginning March 9th. While we recognize that not everyone will be comfortable participating in these indoor eating events and certainly do not wish for anyone to feel pressured to do so, we are glad to be able to extend these opportunities once again.

# Lenten Worship and Education



Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022. The opening words of the Ash Wednesday liturgy are helpful in conveying the

purpose and significance of the season of Lent, leading up to Easter. The officiant says:

"Dear People of God: The first Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church to prepare for them by a season of penitence and fasting. This season of Lent provided a time in which converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when those who, because of notorious sins, had been separated from the body of the faithful were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness, and restored to the fellowship of the Church. Thereby, the whole congregation was put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel of our Savior, and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith. I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. And, to make a right beginning of repentance, and as a mark of our mortal nature, let us now kneel before the Lord, our maker and redeemer." (Book of Common Prayer, 264-265)

St. Mary's will offer online and in-person Ash Wednesday liturgies at the following times:

- 7am pre-recorded liturgy posted to Facebook & YouTube
- 7am in the All Saints' Chapel at St. Mary's
- 7pm in the Nave at St. Mary's

Please note that the imposition of ashes is an optional part of the Ash Wednesday liturgy. At our in-person liturgies, the Officiant will offer ashes. For those worshiping online, all are welcome to pick up a small container of ashes to be used within the context of the online liturgy. Containers may be picked up from the church office during office hours.
