Alleluia, the Lord is risen! THE LORD IS RISEN, INDEED! ALLELUIA!!

Happy Easter to you, dear friends! Even though I am writing these words (and you may be reading them) before our Lenten fasts have completely ended, I have found that in this age of pre-recording liturgies, it is not as much of a stretch for me to place myself "spiritually" into a time yet to come. In fact, I am learning that this practice is itself a helpful one for the Christian life.

In our weekly rhythms of keeping time, many Christians have found it helpful to view every Friday as a mini-Good Friday, taking on special devotions of fasting ("fish Friday" is an example of this for many Christians who fast from red meat on the day). Likewise, every time we gather for worship on Sundays, we are certainly viewing each one as a mini-Easter, as a feast to be celebrated - that's why Sundays are called the Lord's Day.

But, of course, our moods don't always line

up willingly with this rhythm of fasting and feasting. Our emotions don't operate robotically. This world certainly ebbs and flows constantly, and sometimes surprisingly. Which, I think, is the point. As believers - as recipients of the Good News of Jesus' redeeming work on the cross, and His victory over the grave - we are always exercising the skill of looking through whatever current struggle or challenge we face, and trusting that God is at work for good... not necessarily causing it, but seeking to redeem it. This Easter season, no matter what we face, may we all celebrate this sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ.

Alleluia, the Lord is risen! He is risen, indeed! ALLELUIA!!

A HOLY WEEK AT HOME LITURGY BOOKLET has been provided again this year for all who would like to observe this sacred time in that way.

MAUNDY THURSDAY ~ April 1 at 7:00 pm; Online & Church Nave This service recalls the institution of the Last Supper and Jesus' humble act of washing His disciples' feet. It ends with the stripping of the altar and the

beginning of a vigil throughout the night. Following the Maundy Thursday liturgy, a prayer vigil with the Reserved Sacrament begins in the Chapel and ends with communion at the Good Friday liturgy. It is important to affirm especially this year that we are all able to join spiritually, wherever we may be, in this vigil with our Lord who asked His disciples "Could you not keep watch with me for one hour?" (Matthew 26:40). Parishioners will be invited to sign up for the vigil.

GOOD FRIDAY ~ April 2 at Noon; Online & Church Nave

This service begins with silent prayer and includes a homily, the Solemn Collects, the Veneration of the Cross, and the Eucharist from the Reserved Sacrament. The final Way of the Cross will also be offered in the church at **5:45 pm**, ending the Good Friday observance.

HOLY SATURDAY EASTER VIGIL ~ April 3 at 7pm; Outdoors

The Lenten observance officially ends on Saturday evening with this liturgy, one of the most ancient and exciting of the Christian Church - the celebration of the transition from the darkness of Holy Saturday into the light of Christ's Easter Victory. This liturgy will take place at the Rectory's back yard (1102 Rhem St.) and will last about an hour. Join us as we light the New Fire, renew our baptismal vows, and celebrate the first Eucharist of Easter. Worshippers will want to bring their face covering, a lawn chair, flashlight, and something to ring (bells, even shaking car keys works)!

EASTER SUNDAY ~ April 4 at 9:30am; Online & Outdoors, weather permitting

We will celebrate Easter morning with an online Spiritual Communion service as well as one in-person service of Holy Eucharist on the West Lawn at 9:30am. In the event of inclement weather, this service will move indoors with livestream for overflow seating in Moseley Hall as needed. Children are welcome to bring Easter baskets for a special egg hunt immediately following the service.
