



of the church calendar and this year will be on Sunday, May 23rd. Pentecost commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem. Because the Holy Spirit is a gift that provides comfort, encouragement, and guidance and spreads the Good News of Jesus to the world, Pentecost is often understood to be the birthday of the Church. Red is a traditional color of the day, and it is very fitting to wear red as you worship on Pentecost. At. St. Mary's, the altar is adorned with red linens, and you may see streamers, candles, and doves as well.





We hope you will join us for this special liturgy and celebration day in the life of the Church. There will be three worship times available that day: an indoor liturgy of Holy Eucharist, Rite 1 at 8am; an online liturgy of Holy Eucharist with Spiritual Communion, Rite 2 at 8am; and an **outdoor** liturgy of Holy Eucharist, Rite 2 at 9:30am.

This 10-part series, hosted by the Diocese of East Carolina, is built around a curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black,

Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories.

This series will be offered via Zoom. It is open to all and it is primarily designed to help people talk about systemic racism. Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope, and love.


