

Serving with Joy? Really?

Dearest Friends in Christ,

When the Vestry met to determine a phrase that would be easily remembered and capture the heart and spirit of our parish family, the chosen phrase was "Serving with JOY," with the "J" representing "Jesus," the "O" representing our commitment to being with and supporting "others," and the "Y" acknowledging the significance of loving "yourself," but not placing self above God or others. I admit to you that I didn't come to the process with this phrase in mind - I had another idea. But when the conversation turned to JOY and all that it means for the Christian faith, I was all in because joy is what I have experienced in Christ and joy is what I have witnessed in the St. Mary's community!


The word "joy" is frequently spoken synonymously with the emotion of happiness. But they are not the same! Happiness is accurately described as an emotion that ebbs and flows. Praise God for the happiness that we experience, but no one is happy all of the time. Biblical joy, however, is a much deeper, rich, and nuanced entity. It is a fruit of the Holy Spirit that comes with the believer's choice to

want union with Christ. And because unity with Jesus brings us into His promises of salvation and reconciliation with God, as well as His earthly suffering, Christian joy is present in all circumstances. As we join Jesus in His being *for the world*, we align our service with God and others, we have our eyes opened to the brokenness of the world, and we find joy in choosing the one who has already chosen us.

As I write this, there's a lot that makes us unhappy. A pandemic that has claimed 150,000 lives - one of whom called St. Mary's "home." Racial and socio-economic tensions. Political discord. Tough decisions about schooling, jobs, and finances. And now a hurricane is brewing off our coasts. Surely you are holding other, more personal things in your life. May we be reminded, that we are never alone and that Jesus is with us. I recommend reading Paul's letter to the Philippians this month - may it give you joy!

Rejoice in the Lord always! Again, I will say, Rejoice! (Philippians 4:4)

I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. (John 15:11)


Worship

An eight-week "Study of the Gospels" led by the Rev. Dr. Randy Spaugh will kick off the Program Year this September.

Randy writes: We have always assumed that Matthew, Mark, and Luke are basically the same, with John being just a little bit different. While they all have the same message, each one is different, written to a different audience. That is what this study is about. Why does Luke never use the term "Rabbi"? Why is the favorite word of Mark the conjunction "and"? Why does Peter walk on the water in Matthew but not in Mark? Why is 92% of John not found in the other gospels?

Today, we have greater archeological evidence supporting when these gospels were written than we had just 40 years ago, and we hope you can join us as we learn about each of the unique perspectives of the Good News of Jesus!
