The Feast Day of St. Mary the Virgin kicks off our Program Year on Sunday, September 12!

"Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." *(James 1:22, NIV)*

In the Episcopal Church, we are guided in the Scriptures that we read together on Sundays by a schedule of sorts, called a lectionary. Sometimes the lectionary readings are familiar and comfortable. Other times, they are convicting and searing, such that I might have preferred to choose different passages to read and preach if it were up to me. But inevitably, God's Spirit is at work in the scriptures and we should be listening for His Word to us, in whatever it is that our lives are holding. In September, the lectionary gives us a rare 5-week journey through a full book: the Letter of James, which is often referred to as one of the most practical books because it exhorts us to truly *live out* the Christian faith. I hope you'll join us for this sermon series! As you read this edition of the BellRinger, I also hope that you'll be encouraged by the opportunities to *live out* the faith that you've been given with and from this community. The Ministry Fair on St. Mary's Day (Sep 12) will be rich with such opportunities. I also pray that you'll be inspired by God to discern new opportunities of *living out* the faith articulated in our baptismal covenant that don't yet exist. In every case, may we, as a church family, persevere in bearing the Good News of Jesus, adapting to current realities and *living out* that faith that we've been given.

NEW GATHERING GUIDELINES IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID DELTA VARIANT:

In consultation with the vestry and community medical professionals, Fr. Tom has offered updated guidance for the ways that the St. Mary's family gathers. Copies of his letter dated August 25 are in the Narthex and <u>may also be found online at the St. Mary's website</u>. These guidelines will be re-assessed at the September Vestry meeting. Highlights of the updated guidelines include:

- Affirmation and recommendation that all follow CDC guidance regarding face coverings.
- Social distancing encouraged by opening every other pew for seating and re-introduction of the blue "Love your Neighbor" pew sticks in some pews.
- Communion will be brought to parishioners in the pews.
- Outdoor worship returns for the 9:30am liturgy on the 2nd & 4th Sunday, weather permitting.
- Christian Formation for all ages will be held after the 9:30am liturgy beginning Sep. 19.
- Suspension of planned return of indoor meals at St. Mary's.

We pray God's healing to be with all who are ill, God's protections over medical professionals in these times, and may God bless and guide us all in our efforts of loving our neighbors.
